#### 3. BUSINESS ARISING

##### 3.1 Directory of Service Providers

The need for a local/regional directory was also raised at the last Gawler Region Aged Care Network. Felicity Hage has volunteered to put one together. A meeting was held with a few stakeholders last week to determine what it should include. Will be targeted at RAS and ACAT assessors and service providers. Sanna suggested that a single sheet of local service providers could also be developed from the directory to give to consumers.

##### 3.2 Activity Work Plan 2018-2020

Louise Hamilton and 2 other staff from DoH attended last SA Collaborative Projects Network meeting to discuss the new funding agreement for 2018-20. Advised us of what we need to pass onto service providers and what need to be included in our Activity Work Plans which are due 8 June.

Wellness and reablement is the focus and service providers will need to report on how they embed it into their service delivery by 31 October each year.

Deb proposed two activities to be included in the SCAP AWP:

- Information sessions for consumers addressing nutritional requirements for aging people and also importance of maintaining strength and balance, plus information about how the service may change in the future from working for to working with.
- Information sessions for Independent Contractors about how they can incorporate wellness and reablement in to their service provision.

Simon suggested there might be Federal funding available for training for service providers to meet new Common Standards.

Action: Deb to follow up

- CHS recently had quality review and auditors commented on the good relationships between IC's and staff and IC's and clients.  
CHS includes wellness & reablement as part of IC induction process
- CADL – staff have received T & D about wellness & reablement but not IC's – don't have a large number of IC's for aged care.
- BV currently undertake phone reviews with clients.
- Gawler Home Assist at last meeting with IC's noted different attitudes regarding the wellness & reablement approach. Newer IC's tended to be more receptive.
- Barossa Home Assist interested in the sessions for both consumers and IC's.

#### **4 PO REPORT**

Key points:

- Ageing in Style Expos won the regional Minister for Health, Excellence in Public Health Award
- 2018 Wellness & Reablement Symposium – 31 August at Sunnybrae Estate, Regency Park. Bookings will open soon. Submission to Country SA PHN for \$5,000 sponsorship was successful and as a result Adelaide PHN also contributed 1,500. This will be used to produce, direct and film a series of role plays that will be an integral part of the event to demonstrate how to 'do' wellness and re-ablement. A workshop program will be developed to complement the film and be available for T & D for those service providers unable to attend the Symposium.
- Independent Contractors T & D program - A number of providers are willing to contribute to a program in the second half of the year. RDA will run a small business course, Dementia Australia, BPP and ARAS also keen to be involved. Challenge will be finding times when the majority of IC's are available.
