Coordinator update

Coordinator Position has been advertised the Position to be titled Barossa Bushgardens Natural Resource Centre Coordinator.

Ian Baldwin and KJ have negotiated with NRM for a 3 day a week position and are finalising budgets and agreements so as to make the NRC a reality.

The new Coordinator is to be based at the BBG Centre and share the office and there is funding through NRM to set up the office and equip the NRC including IT arrangements.

## 11. Site Management SC Report: Bill Simmons/Ross Dawkins

Direct seeding

Greg Donovan has use of the Roseworthy direct seeder and PP is negotiating dates and selection and sourcing the required seed.

Thursday 22/8, Thursday 19/9, are the dates being optioned so as to synchronize with the TAFE students being at the BBG. The area proposed for seeding is the stretch running East/West behind the Sensory Garden extension and to the Northern edge of the Bio cycle discharge area.

Species include, Acacias, Dodonaea, Senna, possible Bursaria, Hakea, Callitris, Banksia if done near Winter's end/Spring's commencement.

We are yet to decide on formation as it could be done in spirals, curvy, crossover or straight lines. Plantings would need to be thinned out after germination to the required spacings. Greg would space seed drop as wide as possible to allow for 2-3 metre spacing between plants. Also treatment for red-legged earth mite, and Greg has a permit to use the required chemical.

**Action:** The Committee agreed that we go ahead with the direct seeding.

### Labyrinth

The BC Labyrinth committee was wondering if you have been given the official coordinates for the labyrinth done by Carolyn Herkes, decided upon last December, at the B/Gardens Site and has there been an official allocation of land given for the landscaping the area around the labyrinth, by the BB Gardens.

We are waiting for Carolyn Herkes to send through final plans for the actual labyrinth, not sure why it seems to be taking so long, but we expect them through very soon, now. They are also waiting to hear whether we have been successful with one local funding application and in process of submitting Country Arts SA application.
