

MINUTES OF THE ANGAS RECREATION PARK COMMITTEE
MEETING HELD ON 27 MAY 2015 AT 7:30PM

GUEST SPEAKER

Neville Smith, representing the Angaston Bowling Club, updated on the latest proposal for the building of new rinks and clubrooms with a detailed drawing showing the location options for consideration. Due to the specified size and shape requirements of the proposed development, the location would be restricted to two areas in order to clear existing drainage services, that is, the SE corner of the park, and the SW area of former residence site next to the cricket practice nets.

Council have indicated either location would appear suitable. The SE corner option would require relocation of the existing skate board park, which the Football Club have indicated would be preferred closer to their clubrooms anyway. As for the SW area, the Football Club would not be in favour of this area as they have plans for other developments, such as, a mini oval. It was recommended that they submit formal notice of their intention explaining their interest be submitted as soon as possible to ascertain the best utilisation of this area.

BUSINESS ARISING

Restructuring of S41 community committees - Craig Grocke has inquired about the progress of the park committee in deciding the areas of interest and level of engagement for development of a new terms of reference. Cr M Grossman to request a copy of a typical template for an advisory group.

The Table Tennis Club have offered to replace the existing flouro tubes in the Show Hall to improve lighting. The proposed use is now likely to only commence in 2016.

The north eastern perimeter drain along the bottom tennis courts has been trimmed up but the recent heavy rain still overflowed onto the courts. This requires the earthen bank to be dug back further to form a distinct drainage ditch.

Black sooty scale – there has been no action reported – the dead shrub and adjacent golden ash tree should be treated or removed to prevent spreading to other plants.

The control of parking adjacent to the pencil pines during the last home game was much improved with placement of witches hats, although could be extend further along.

Ten new refuse bins with orange lids have been installed.

Cutting away swivelling collar remaining from turnstile on bottom tennis courts has yet to be completed. Also a protruding pipe left from old cricket practice nets on edge of roadway opposite scoreboard the should be cut off.

GENERAL BUSINESS

M Klingner reported a limb on the blue cedar tree below the eastern entrance is hanging very low and requires removal.

N Vaughan reported a underground water pipe near the scoreboard that is leaking and discharging to the surface. Also concern about vehicle and pedestrian traffic between playground and toilets that has the potential for a collision – suggest a pedestrian crossing sign or speed humps on roadway.

Cr M Grossman reported that the log chopping site will be relocated further south which will involve removal of the concrete bases. The Show committee will be conveying their concerns to Council over the changes to the access doors on the Show Hall.
