

Genetically Modified (GM) Crops consultation

Legislation has been passed by the SA Government to lift the Genetically Modified (GM) moratorium to allow GM crops to be grown on mainland South Australia under changes to the *Genetically Modified Crops Management Act 2004*. Councils may apply to the Minister for Primary Industries and Regional Development to retain 'Non-GM crop area' status.

The Barossa Council is seeking the views of community, business and industry on potential trade and marketing impacts of GM crops and whether there is support in making an application to be designated as a 'Non-GM crop area'.

Council invites submissions via a survey available at Council's principal office 43-51 Tanunda Road, Nuriootpa and Council branch officer or online at yoursay.barossa.sa.gov.au. Submissions are to be received by 5.00pm, 19 August 2020.
