## Recycling FORTNIGHTLY collection

- Paper and cardboard
- Pizza boxes unsoiled
- Milk and juice cartons
- Magazines, newspapers and books
- Glass bottles and jars
- Aluminium cans and foil
- Food tins/steel cans (empty)
- Hard plastic bottles and containers from the kitchen, bathroom and laundry (eg ice cream, shampoo, detergent)
- Plastic takeaway food containers
- Plastic cutlery
- Biscuit trays
- Yoghurt containers



## Organics FORTNIGHTLY collection \*OPTIONAL SERVICE\*

- Food scraps and peels
- Leaves, branches, lawn clippings and garden matter
- Cake and bread scraps
- Fruit and vegetables
- Tea bags and coffee grounds
- Meat scraps and bones (cooked or raw)
- Seafood (cooked or raw)
- Egg shells and oyster shells
- Tissues and paper towels
- Pizza boxes soiled
- Dairy products (eg cheese, yoghurt)
- Hair
- Compostable bags



## Rubbish WEEKLY collection

- Bubble wrap, plastic bags, cling film, garbage bags
- Cigarette butts/ash
- Cleaning sponges/cloths
- Clothing
- Crockery
- Disposable nappies
- Foam containers/trays/packaging
- Kitty litter
- String/twine/ropes
- Vacuum cleaner dust
- items that cannot be placed in the recycling or organics bin



The Barossa Council

Residents currently receive a mandatory weekly collection service for **rubbish** (140L red bin), a mandatory fortnightly collection service for **recycling** (240L yellow bin) and an optional fortnightly collection service for **organics** for township residents (240L green bin), provided at an additional cost. Special provisions may apply for residents with a greater number of permanent occupants and those with eligible medical conditions. ## What's not allowed in any bin X

- X acid
- X car parts and batteries
- X car bodies
- X tyres
- X engines
- X chemicals
- X pool chemicals
- X hard/heavy materials
- X hot ashes
- X gas bottles
- X oils
- X liquid
- X timber
- X paint and solvents
- X e-waste

These items may be disposed of at Council's Springton Waste Transfer Station.



## Disposal of green waste

Green waste can be deposited at the Springton waste transfer station, where the fees are \$25 for utes and a 6x4 trailer load (to water level), \$30 for utes and a 6x4 trailer load (above water level), \$60 for a truck up to five tonne GMV and \$100 for a tandem truck load.



## Disposal of hazardous waste

Council does not provide a hazardous waste program. If this service is required please contact Council who can advise of suitable locations depending on the type of waste material.

## Springton Waste Transfer Station

The Barossa Council operates a waste transfer station at Springton (located on the Springton road, approximately four kilometres out of Springton).

The Springton Waste Transfer Station is located on the Springton to Williamstown Road, approximately four kilometres out of Springton.

The station is open on the second Saturday of each month, from 9am to 3pm. The transfer station does not operate on days declared Total Fire Ban.

The following items **will not be accepted**: permapine posts, tyres, loose paper, plastic, car bodies, asbestos, chemical containers, poisons, paint tins. Old fridges and freezers will only be accepted if gas cylinders and doors have been removed.

Proof of identification is required (by rate notice or drivers licence) for the resident fee to apply. EFTPOS facilities are not available - only cash or cheque accepted.
