# Opportunities to have your say

The next phase of community consultation as part of The Big Project continues with the release of a draft masterplan for the Nuriootpa Centennial Park and Coulthard Reserve precinct.

We're encouraging you to have your say on the vision for the future use of this precinct which seeks to expand the contemporary recreation facilities and bring more community members back to the natural setting of Coulthard Reserve.

Council is asking for community feedback on the concepts, which seek to:

- Expand soccer facilities and provide additional multi-code changerooms
- Enhance Coulthard Reserve play spaces
- Reinstate Coulthard Reserve lake on a smaller scale with a natural amphitheatre for recreation and community use
- Improve pedestrian/cycling movement including walking and cycling linkages
- Create a new home for Scouts in Coulthard Reserve
- Enhance traffic management and parking provision.

Consultation runs until 13 December and you can make a comment in a variety of ways.

Pop-ups will be held at Barossa Co-op on December 2 (9am - noon) and December 6 (2.30pm - 6pm) while a drop-in session will be held at the Nuriootpa Centennial Park Sports Centre on December 5 from 4.30pm to 7.30pm.
