Towns benefit from upgrades

Major works will significantly improve drainage and pedestrian access in Springton and Mount Pleasant.

A \$3 million investment in footpaths and sealed roads to enhance amenity and safety for Springton residents is entering the next phase of construction.

Seven local roads – Gilbert, Eckerts, Rose, Johannes, William and Miller Streets plus Graetz Terrace – will be upgraded as part of Stage 2 of the project.

Work in Mount Pleasant includes:

- construction of new drainage and kerbing on the northern side of Melrose Street from Talunga Park to approximately No. 35 Melrose Street
- construction of a new footpath, removing the double stepped kerb, and installing new drainage and kerbing on the southern side of Melrose Street from Saleyard Road to approximately No. 102 Melrose Street.
