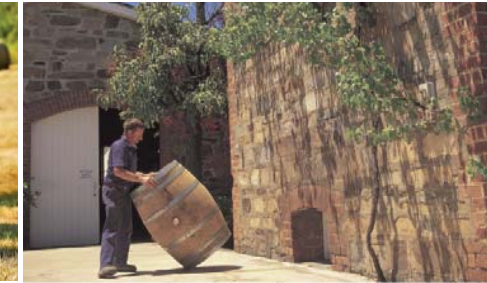

The community can celebrate the opening of the multi-million Jack Bobridge Track at 'Barossa by Bike', a series of themed events on the weekend of May 24-25.

Sample the best of the Barossa's food, wine and cycling trails with a range of mostly free and family-friendly events including live entertainment, art exhibitions, produce and artisan markets and a group ride on the new 27km track.

The weekend of festivities coincides with Velo-City, the world's premier cycle planning conference being held in Adelaide from May 27-30 (www.velo-city2014).

Art and signage to guide the way



Manager Community & Culture Maz McGann and artist Mal Wass with a replica of the 4.2 metre high sculpture.

A 4.2 metre high sculpture has been unveiled as the signature piece of public art on the Jack Bobridge Track.

The landmark design 'Vessel Earth' by Mal Wass pays homage to the earth and wines that define our region.

The sculpture will be constructed from formed rammed earth, depicting the local soil profile on a massive scale using local quarried materials.

A large relief of a wine glass in the front face of the sculpture is instantly recognisable, paying tribute to the Barossa's "notable standing in the wine industry".

It will be located alongside the track between Tanunda and Rowland Flat.

Meanwhile, five signs interpreting the Barossa's rich heritage will be unveiled

at strategic points along the Jack Bobridge Track.

The signs aim to educate trail users about the history and folklore of the region, from rail disasters (pictured below) and the Barossa goldrush to the ghostly hitchhiker of Jacob's Creek.

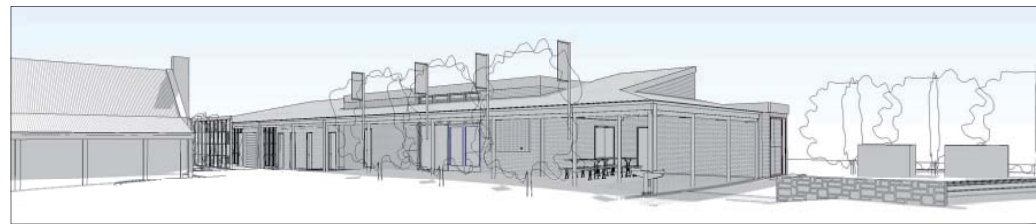

Tender let for Cycle Hub



Barossa company BGI Building Group has been awarded the tender to build the Barossa Cycle Hub in Tanunda following a selective tender process.

Mayor Brian Hurn said it was pleasing to see a local company with the skill and experience to take on a specialised project like the Cycle Hub.

"BGI have a good track record with Council, having extended the Lyndoch Town Hall in 2009, and have a strong working relationship with the architects (JBG) and local trades," he said.

Company directors Neil and Jenny Zerna

said it was a first for their firm.

"We do a lot of diversified project work - we build everything from modest offices to warehouses and wineries - but this is our first cycle hub," Jenny said.

"It reflects our versatility and capacity to respond to wide-ranging project briefs, and we're thrilled to be involved in such an innovative project."

The Hub will improve cycling facilities for residents and visitors, and include public toilets. The project is co-funded by the Australian Government under the Tourism Industry Regional Development Fund.

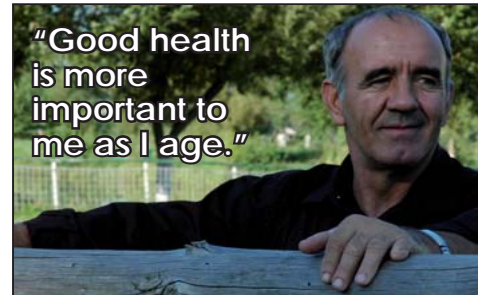

That's why Barossa, Light, Gawler and Mallala Councils are asking for public feedback on a draft Regional Public Health and Wellbeing Plan.

The Plan will provide a strategy for promoting health and wellbeing through council functions and partnerships with key community stakeholders.

It outlines a vision to help the community live well through regional collaboration, community participation, planning, education and regulatory enforcement.

Barossa, Light, Gawler and Mallala Councils are working with RDA Barossa to ensure the plan reflects community priorities.

After extensive consultation with stakeholders, a draft plan is now complete and aligns with both the new State Health Plan and the existing strategic plans developed by these councils.
