Bike Friendly Business initiative

Council, supported by the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (under the Local Government Partnership program), is collaborating with businesses in the Barossa to create a program of incentives and activities that will increase cycling in the region.

We invite businesses to develop and trial the 'Bike Friendly Business' initiative.

What this initiative may involve

Discussions will take place with businesses to determine activities and incentives for cyclists, which may include:

- displaying 'Bike Friendly Business' promotional sign/sticker
- providing suitable bike parking/storage
- accommodating seating for groups of bike riders
- storing basic bike maintenance equipment
- offering water bottle refills
- taking part in promotional cycle events
- considering cyclist discounts and special offers

Vote on new name for CWA Hall

The ownership of the Hall (pictured) was recently transferred to Council at the request of the South Australian Country Women's Association Incorporated and local Tanunda Branch, and Council would like to rename the facility to reflect the change in ownership and emphasise the community focus of the hall.



Mayor Bob Sloane, said the hall has, and will remain an integral part of the Tanunda Town Square, and acknowledged the great contribution of the CWA and its strong and continuing working relationship with Council. The hall's original opening plaque acknowledging the CWA contribution will continue to occupy pride of place outside of the hall.
