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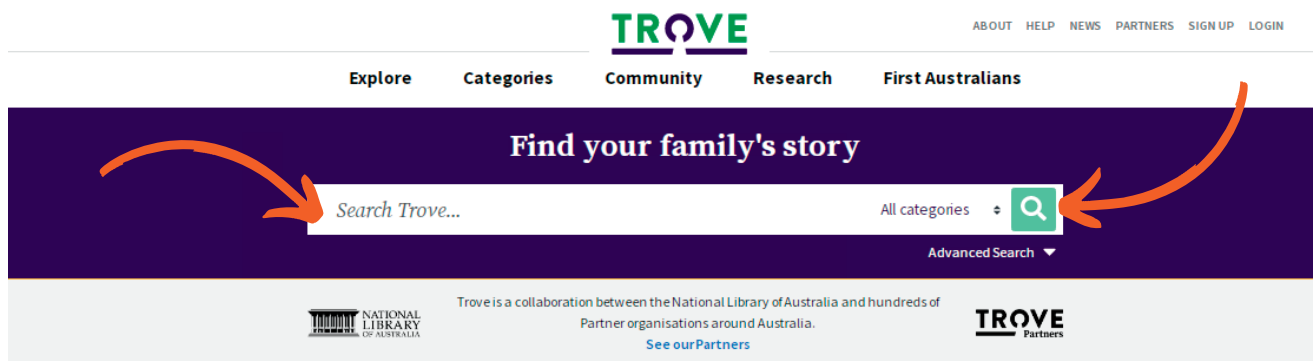
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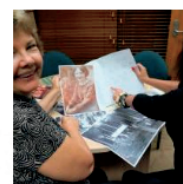
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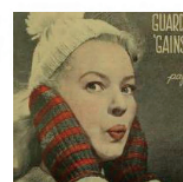

After a service in the Church of England, Ballina, conducted by Canon W. Burvill, who also officiated at the graveside, she was buried in the Church of England portion of the East Ballina cemetery. Pall-bearers were Messrs. N. Smith, R. Thompson (nephews), E. Hoschke (son-in-law), D. Coster, G. Lee, F. Uden. Wreath carriers were Messrs. W. Thompson (nephew), F. West, W. Thomas, R. Jordan, P. IRRIGATION SURVEY ON MAIN ARM

MULLUMBIMBY, Wednesday. — With a view to increasing attendance at meetings of Mullumbimby Agricultural Society, Mr. S. Wallis will move at the next committee meeting that alternate meetings of the society be held at night.

Mr. Wallis said he had been requested by members of the committee, who were often unable to attend meetings during the day to give notice of motion that committee meetings be held at night.

Mr. Wallis said that on a previous occasion when a vote was taken it was defeated by only one vote. He said he felt there would be a better attendance at night meetings.

The programme submitted for the ring events at the rodeo to be held on June 5 and the poultry schedule were adopted.

Mr. O. McPaul reported that he had contacted 11 farmers on the Main Arm in connection with an irrigation scheme for that locality. Each had indicated his willingness to co-operate and share the cost of a survey. The landholders' share of the cost of the survey would be £55, said Mr. McPaul.

If the survey proved to be satisfactory all the farmers interested would be prepared to proceed with the scheme, he added. Mr. McPaul said the scheme would be financed by the Government through the Irrigation and Conservation Commission to the extent of 90 per cent. through the Rural Bank and would be repayable over a term of 15 years at a low rate of interest.
