Bradley Ron Howship was born March 1989 in Box Hill, Victoria.

After completing his schooling, he undertook an Information Technology traineeship in Ringwood, Victoria before enlisting in the Australian Army at the age of 23 as a Technical Electrician within the Royal Australian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers (RAEME).

Following completion of recruit training, Bradley attended the Army School of Electrical and Mechanical Engineering in Bandiana, Victoria, where he undertook his trade training.

Upon graduating, he was posted to Darwin, Northern Territory to complete his on-the-job training.

Bradley was later posted to the 1st Combat Signal Regiment, where his professionalism and technical ability were recognised with a Silver Army Commendation for performing to a high standard.

He was subsequently posted to the 1st Combat Service Support Battalion in Adelaide. During his time with this battalion, he was promoted to Lance Corporal and later deployed to the Greater Middle East Area of Operations, including Afghanistan.

Following his deployment he was promoted to Corporal. Bradley was later posted to the 1st Armoured Regiment, based at Edinburgh R.A.F., where he continued to serve until his discharge from the Australian Army in 2024.

During his service, Corporal Bradley Ron Howship was awarded the Australian Defence Medal (ADM), the NATO Medal (Non-Article 5), and the Australian Operational Service Medal – Greater Middle East Operation.

Today, Bradley enjoys spending his weekends with his wife and three children, reflecting with pride on his years of service to Australia.



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
