Background

The Moculta District History Society Incorporated has been established for over 15 years, and has an active membership base of 26 people.

Introduction

The Moculta District History Society Incorporated first published 'A Heritage Walk of Moculta' in 2007 to commemorate the milestones of the Moculta Primary School, the Moculta Soldier's Memorial Hall and the Moculta Recreation Park. The interest shown led to the formation of the Moculta District History Society Incorporated.

Since then, several changes have occurred within the township.

The Moculta District History Society Incorporated are seeking funds to assist with reprinting the brochures, which will be updated to reflect minor changes.

Discussion

The Moculta District History Society Incorporated is responsible for the upkeep of the State Heritage listed Shannon Mausoleum, its grounds and the public liability insurance for the Linke Stripper Shelter located at the Moculta Recreation Park.

Current funds are allocated to the above projects, therefore the Society are seeking Council funding assistance to ensure their financial viability.

Summary and Conclusion

The brochure is a valuable tool to promote the history of Moculta, and will benefit visitors and residents alike.

PURPOSE

REPORT

Background

The Stockwell Community Association Incorporated was established approximately two years ago with the aim of promoting, documenting and preserving the history of Stockwell for current and future generations.

The Committee currently consists of 15 dedicated volunteers.

Introduction

The Barossa Heritage Trail app was launched in May 2022, and features six self-guided walking trails and one driving trail, the interactive app highlights the rich and sometimes little-known heritage stories and experiences of the region.

The trails were created with local heritage groups and features the townships of Angaston, Bethany, Light Pass, Mount Pleasant and Tanunda, with a trail for Nuriootpa coming soon.

The project is an initiative of The Barossa Council Public Libraries supported by Barossa Regional Heritage Network, Foundation Barossa and the Peter Lehmann Arts and Education Trust.

The Barossa Heritage Trail app is available for free download on Apple and Android devices.

Discussion

The Stockwell Community Association (the Association) are applying for a Community Grant with the goal of including Stockwell in the Barossa Heritage Trail app, a platform to showcase Stockwell's visual history but also document its oral history, ensuring that the voices and stories of its residents are preserved for future generations.

In addition to the proposed inclusion of Stockwell on the Barossa Heritage Trail app, the application includes the provision of preservation of Stockwell's photographic heritage, safeguarding the visual treasures in acid-free photography books.

Summary and Conclusion

The inclusion of Stockwell in the Barossa Heritage Trail app, and the preservation of Stockwell's photographic history, will ensure that future generations will have access to a multifaceted understanding of Stockwell's history.

Collaborating closely with local residents, historical societies and community organisations, a wealth of oral histories, anecdotes and personal narratives will be collected and recorded.

PURPOSE

REPORT

Background

The Barossa Go-Kart was established approximately 70 years ago, and became an Incorporated Body in September 2002.

Barossa Go-Kart Club Incorporated core purpose is that of developing community and social interactions through the sport of Go-Karting, and providing the community one of five tracks within South Australia.

Introduction

Robinson Park Raceway, the home of the Barossa Go Kart Club is located just off the Sturt Highway at 9 Belvidere Road Nuriootpa.

The Club is well supported, with a membership basis of approximately 300 including family members.

Discussion

Current cash holdings will be fully depleted by critical repairs to the track, which is needed to ensure safe operations.

As the existing funds are allocated to the above repairs, the Club is seeking financial assistance for the purchase of the Marquees.

Summary and Conclusion

The purchase of the Marquees will ensure protection from inclement weather conditions for spectators and participants.

The purchase will also enable the Club to raise their presence at community events such as town shows, parades and fund raising events.

Officers recommend that, should the Committee approve the funding, that recognition of Council's contribution be included in the promotion of the project and any project deliverables.

REPORTBackground

The Mount Pleasant Farmers Market Inc. was established approximately twelve years ago, with the aim of supporting local farmers and food producers in delivering fresh, quality produce, and provides an opportunity to showcase local businesses and produce.

The Farmer's Market is well supported by locals and visitors alike and promotes a strong sense of community.

The Farmer's Market is a not-for-profit organisation, and any income generated is invested back into running the Farmer's Market.

Introduction

As part of the Mount Pleasant Farmer's Market, the Annual Spring Garden Festival has been running for over seven years and each year sees a growth in attendance numbers and enthusiasm.

The 2024 Annual SA Spring Garden Festival is planned for 21 September 2024, and it is anticipated that attendance numbers will be in the vicinity of between 8,000 and 10,000 people.

Discussion

The Mount Pleasant Farmer's Market are aiming to expand the 2024 Spring Garden Festival, offering a VIP guest, and creating some larger and more attractive entrances closer to the festival, and engage paid traffic management to ensure a smooth flow of visitors.

In previous years, The Barossa Council have provided in-kind support by way of provision of 'slow down' road signs on Melrose Street to help with congestion on the day.

Summary and Conclusion

The 2024 Annual SA Spring Garden Festival offers the opportunity and encouragement for visitors to participate in workshops, and educational talks. It also provides an environment for local businesses to participate and share knowledge, and sell their products.

Officers recommend that, should be Committee approve the request for funding, that recognition of Council's contribution be included in the promotion of the project and other project deliverables.

PURPOSE

To consider a Community Grant application (the Application) for the South Australian Indoor Bias Bowls Association Inc., seeking \$5,000 (ex GST) towards the facilitation of the 54th Australian Indoor Bias Bowls National Championships.

REPORT

Background

The South Australian Indoor Bias Bowls Association Inc. (SAIBBA) was established approximately 80 years ago, with the aim to provide an avenue and opportunity for all people to participate in the activity of Indoor Bias Bowling at a variety of levels including locally, regionally, State, National and International.

Introduction

The 54th Australian Indoor Bias Bowls National Championships are being held in Tanunda (based at The Rex Barossa Aquatic Fitness Centre) over a six day period commencing 25 August 2024. It is envisaged that the Championships will bring over 300 participants (plus family and friends) to the Barossa Valley.

Discussion

SAIBBA have applied for a Community Grant to assist with costs associated with staging the six-day Championships. SAIBBA had approached both State and Federal departments, including Tourism and Events, but are not eligible for any of the State or funding grants due to the comparatively small number of participants.

Participants will be travelling from NSW, Victoria, Tasmania and Queensland in addition to South Australia (both metropolitan and regional areas) and it could be assumed that the majority of the participants will require accommodation, creating a flow on benefit to hospitality and tourism businesses in the Barossa.

Summary and Conclusion

The 54th Australian Indoor Bias Bowls National Championships will be held in Tanunda over a six day period commencing 25 August 2024, and is expected to attract in the vicinity of 300 participants, bringing economic benefits to various businesses in the Barossa Valley.

Officers recommend that, should the Committee approve the request for funding, that recognition of Council's contribution be included in the promotion of the project and other project deliverables.
